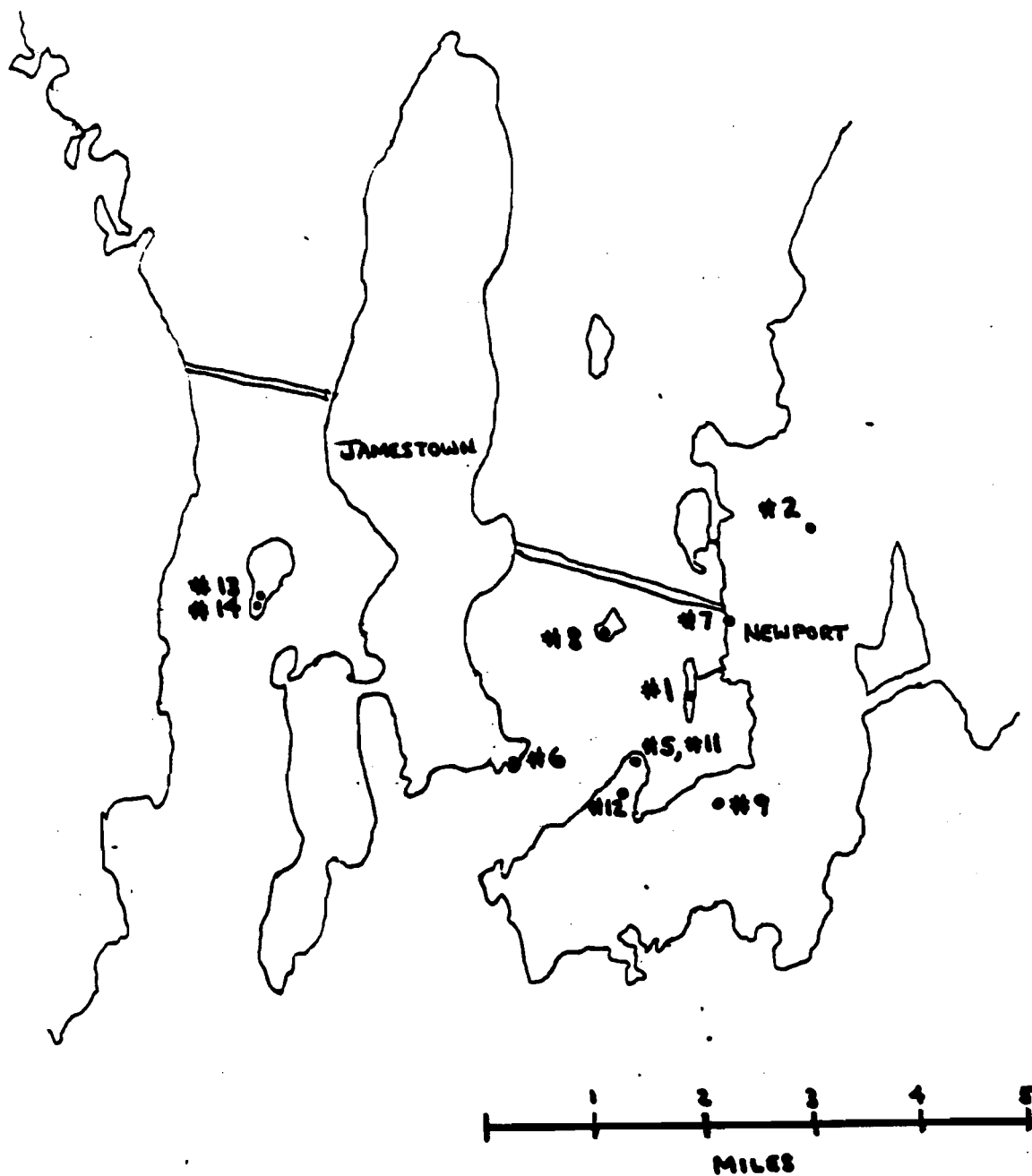
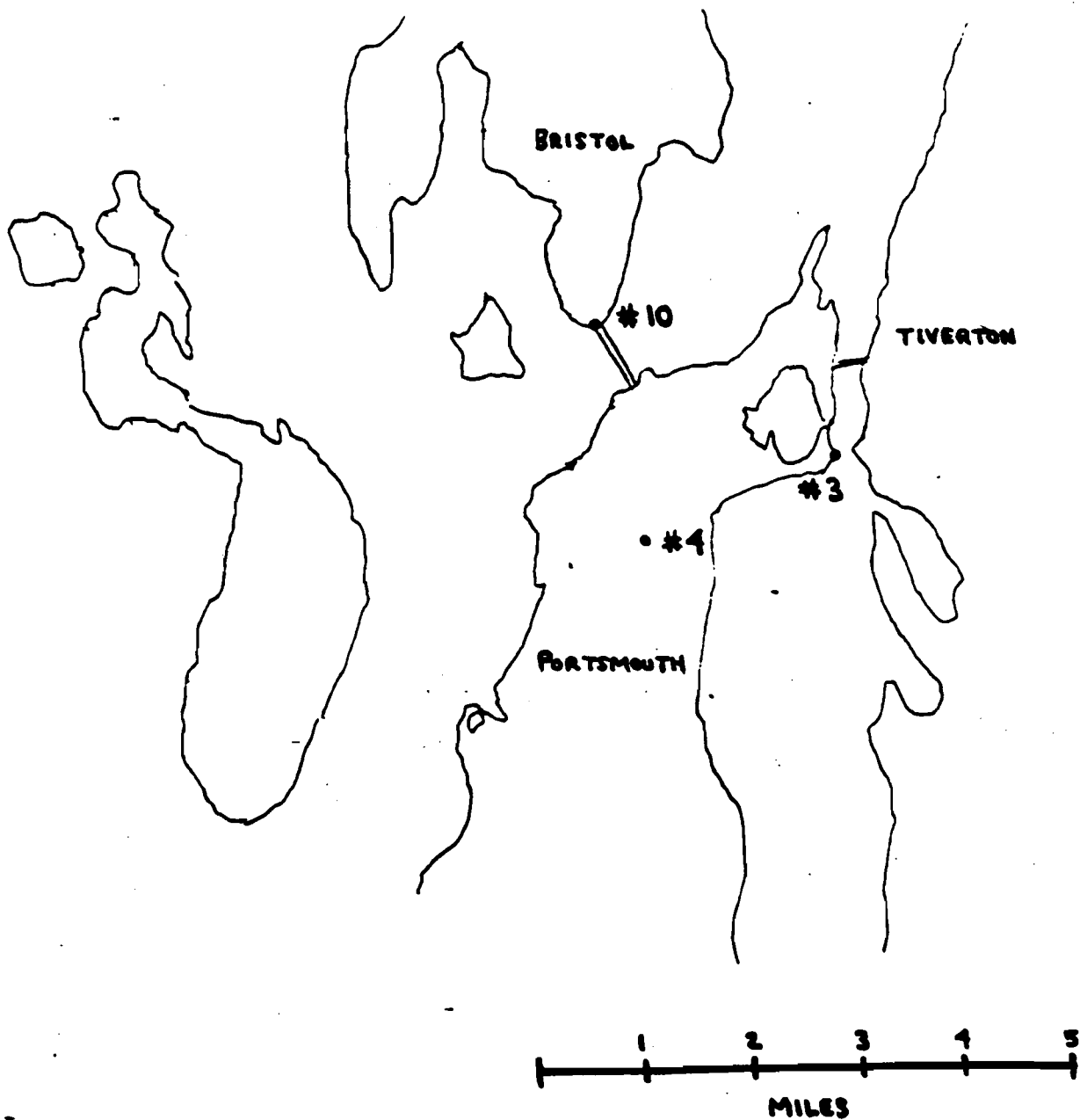
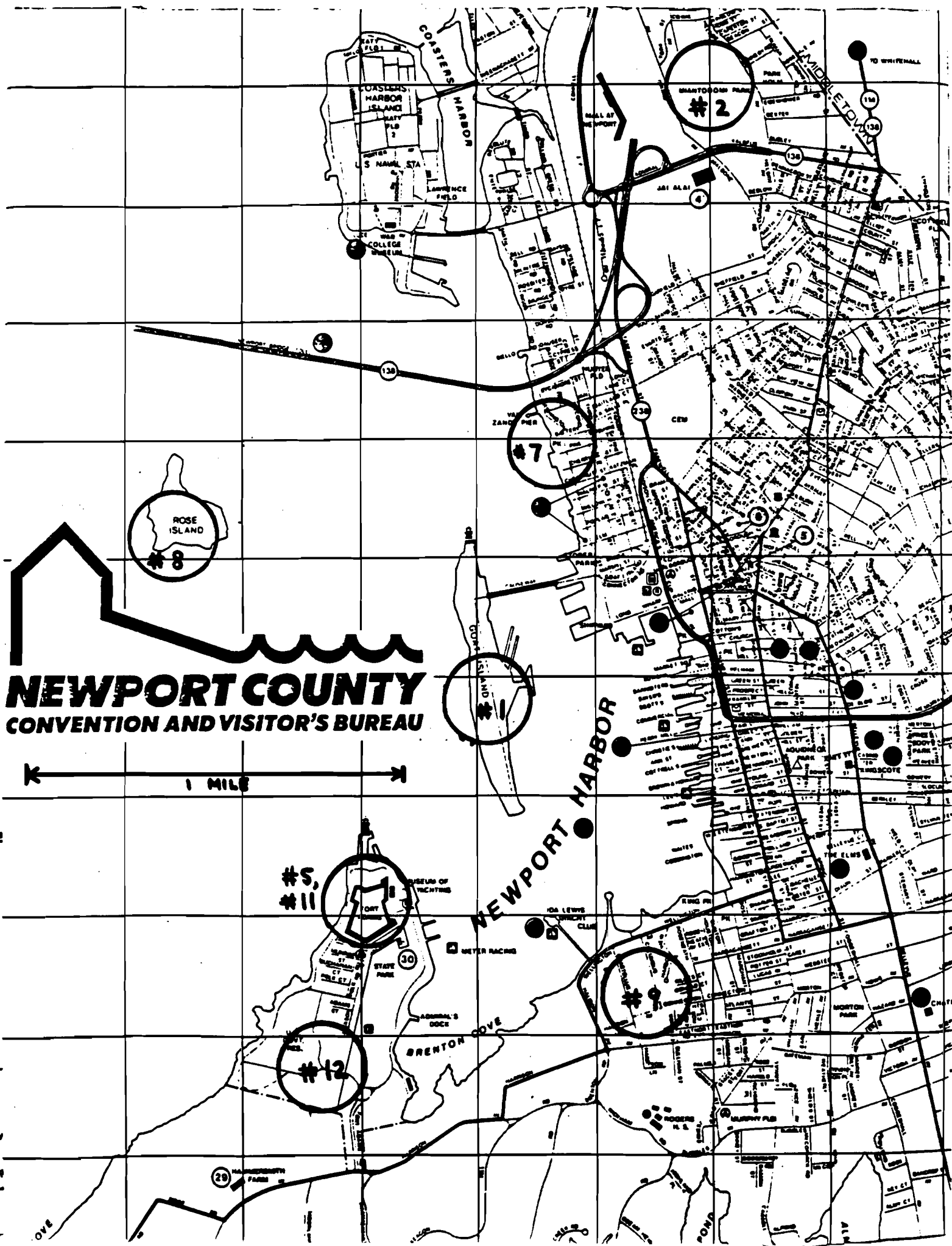


Narragansett Bay (South)

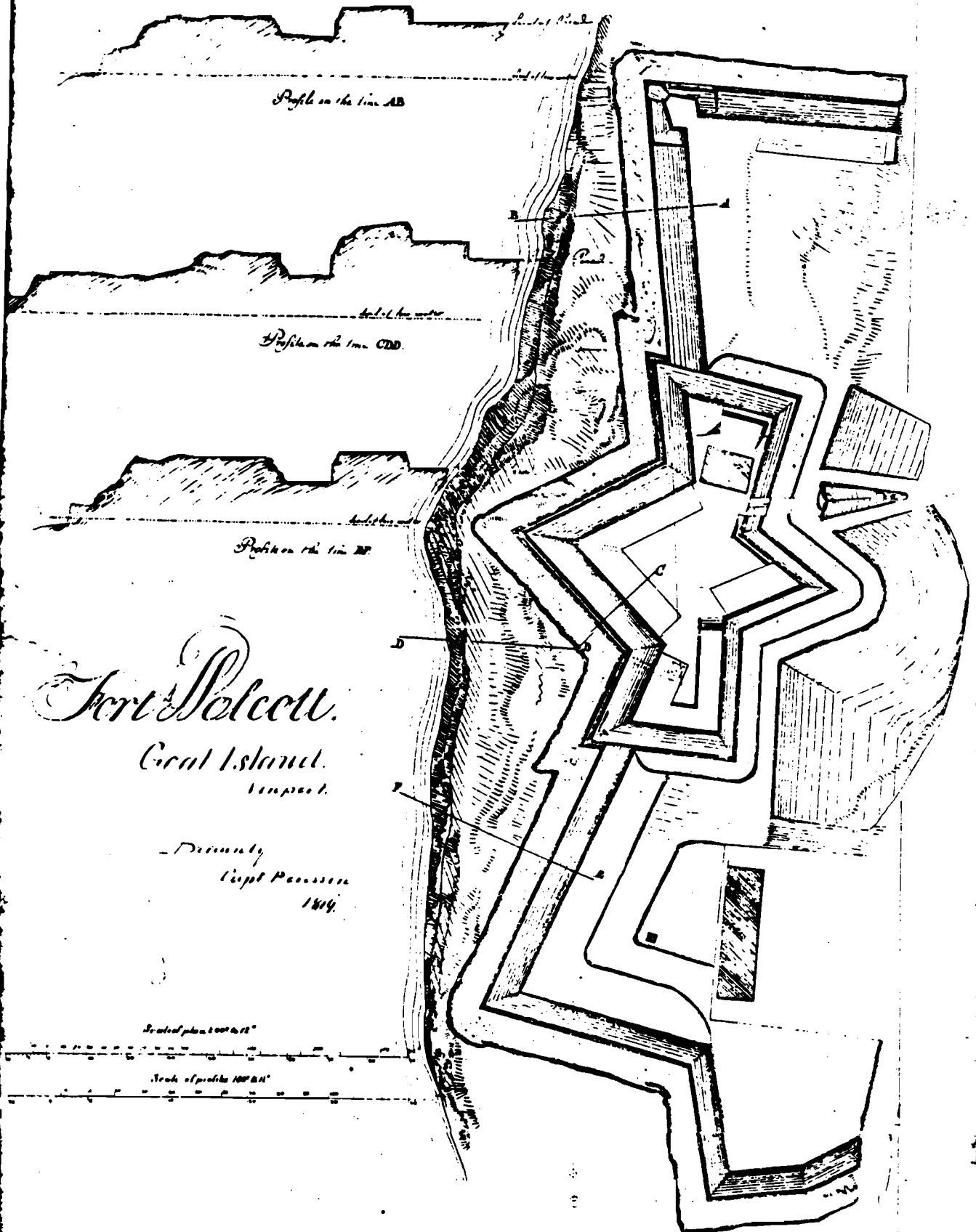

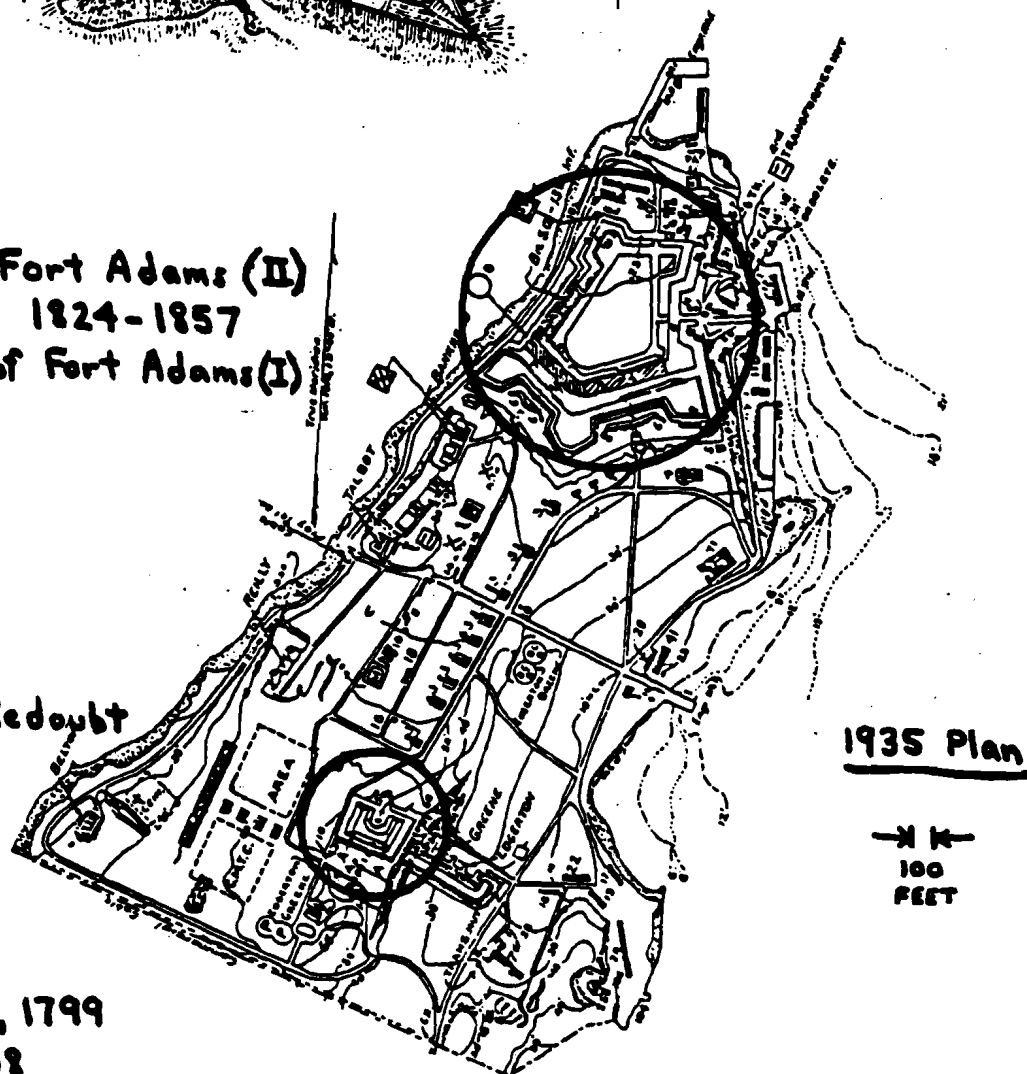

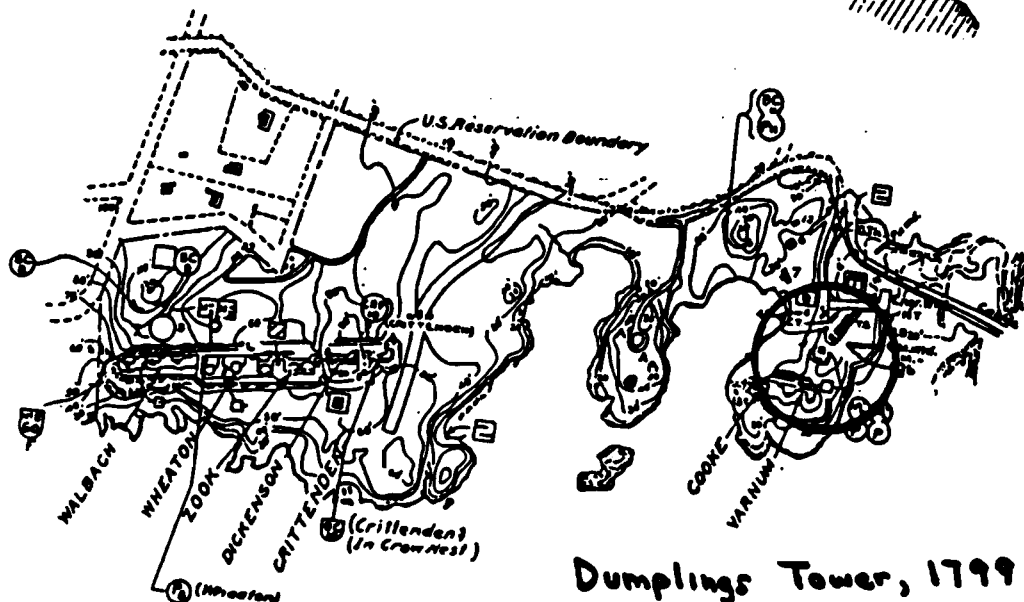
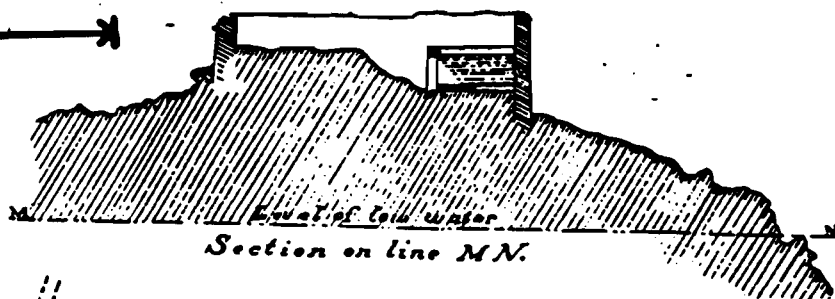
#6 Dumplings Tower 1799

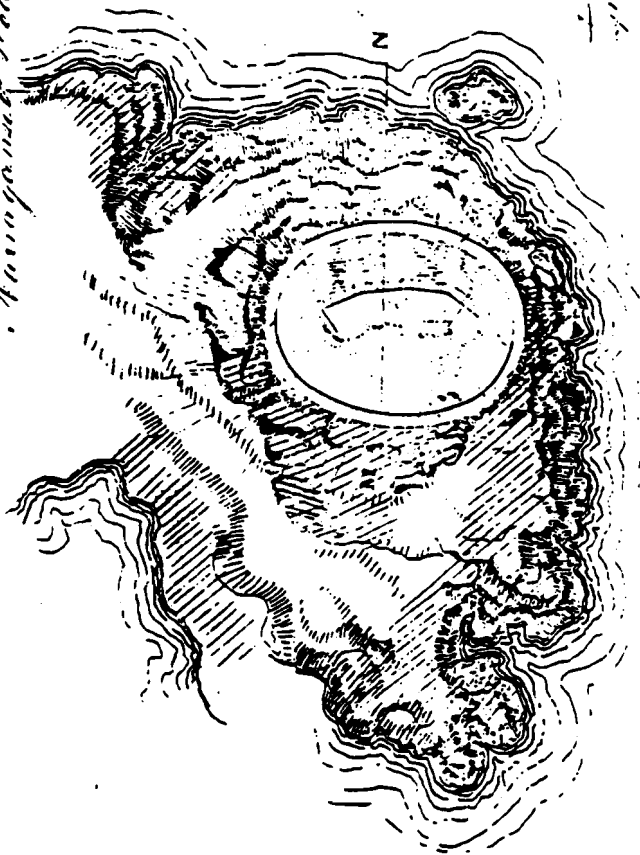

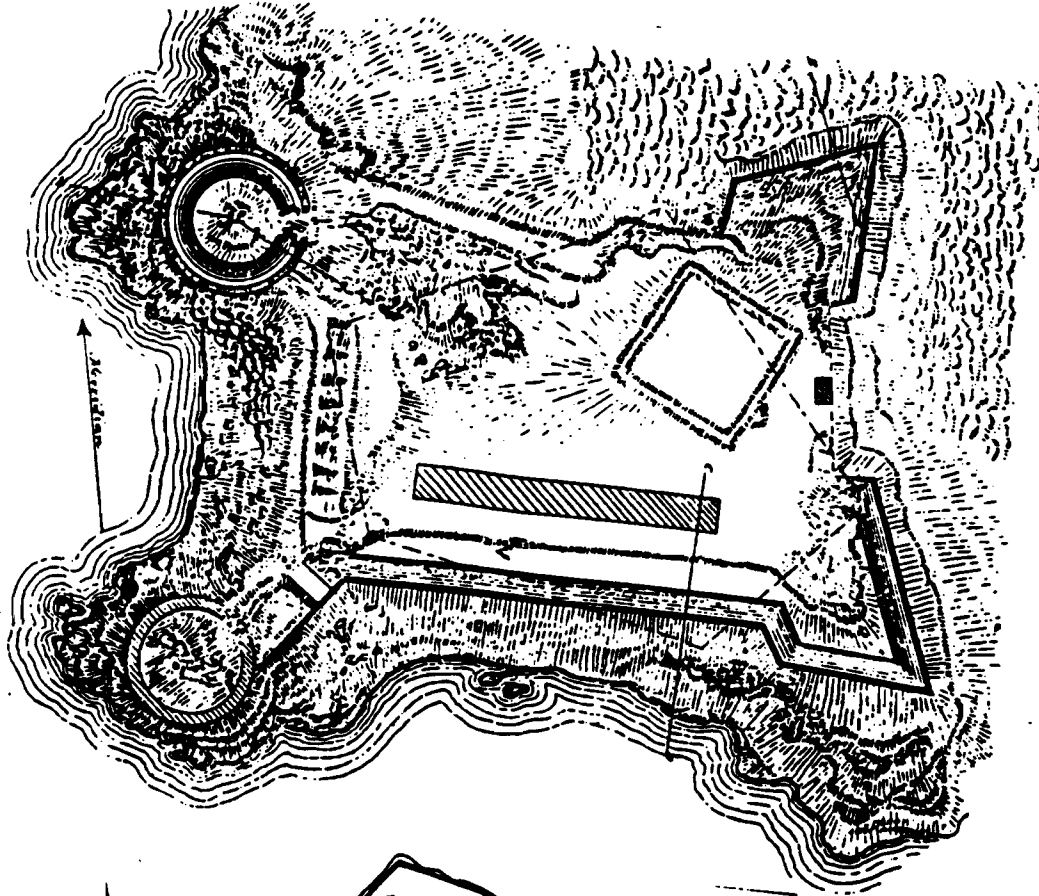

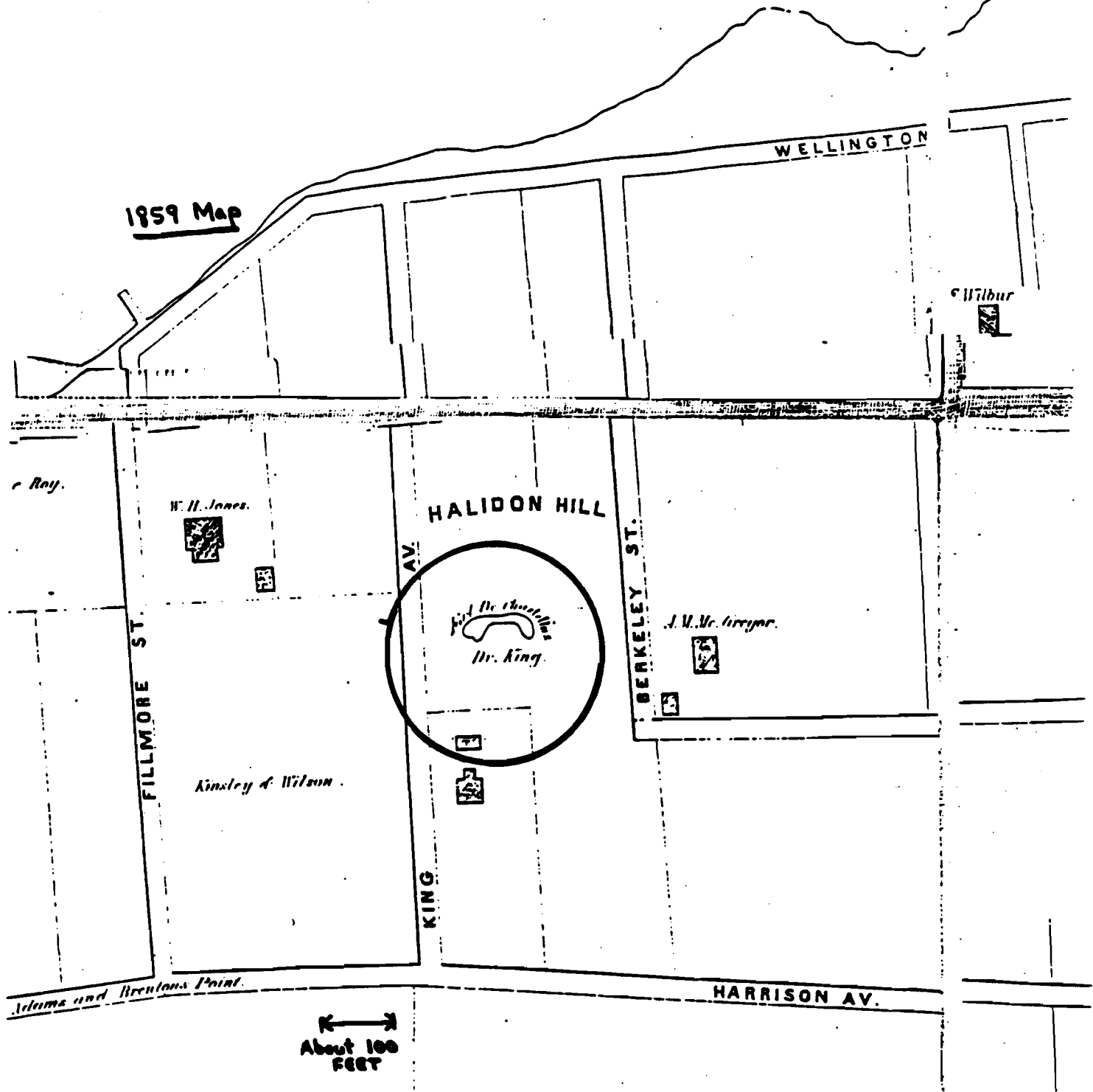

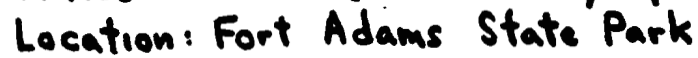

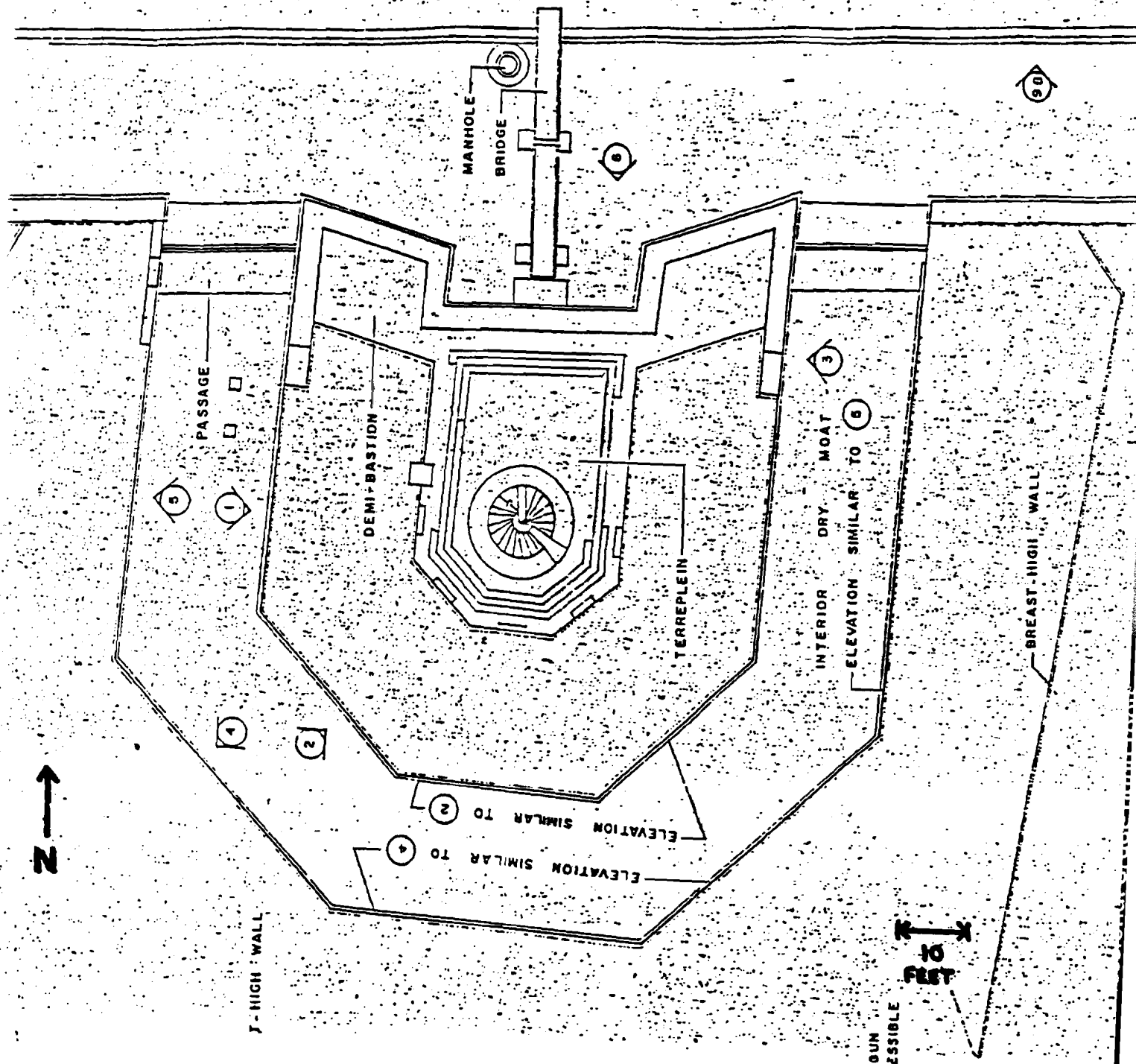
#11 Fort Adams (II) Listening Tunnels

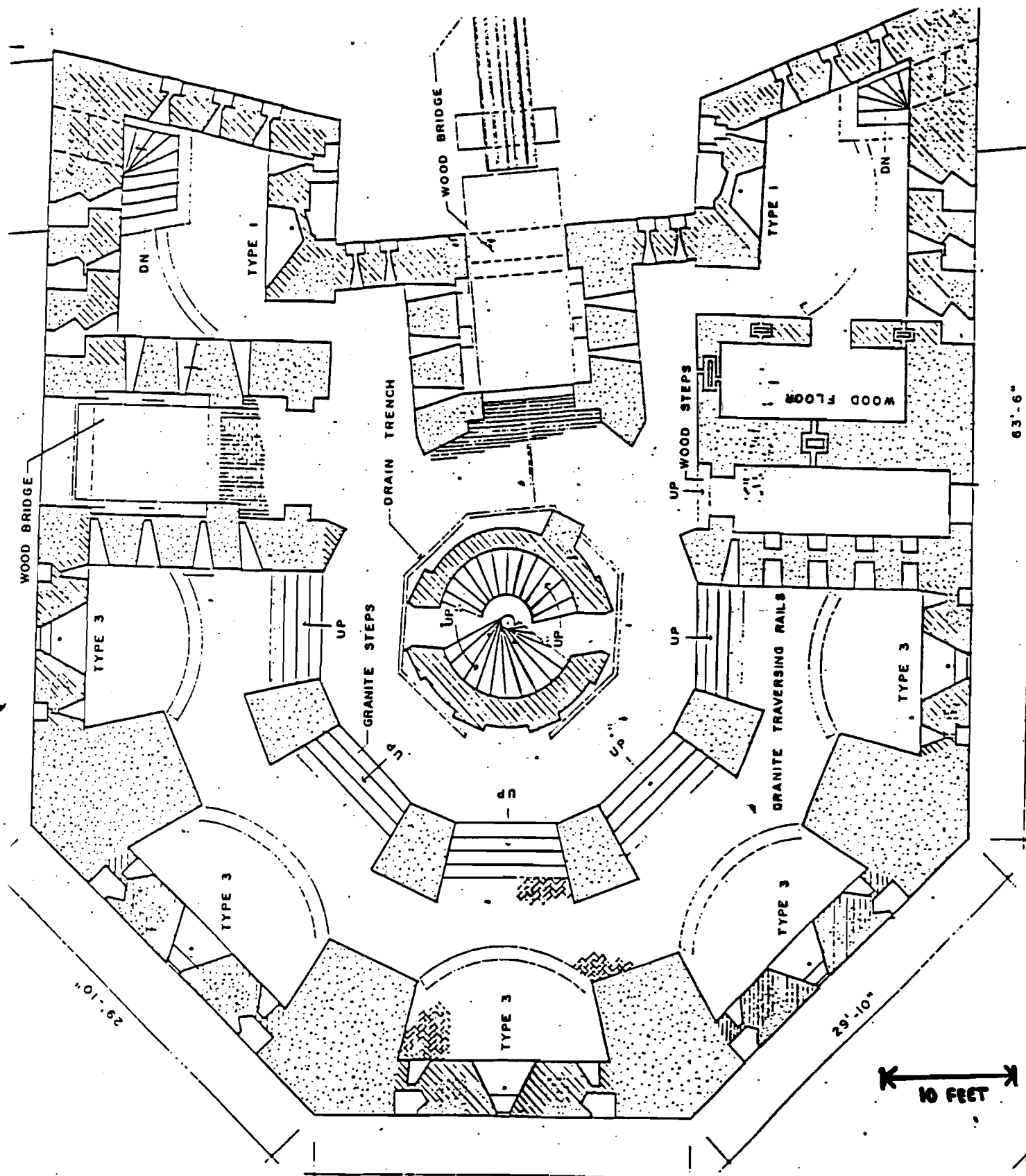

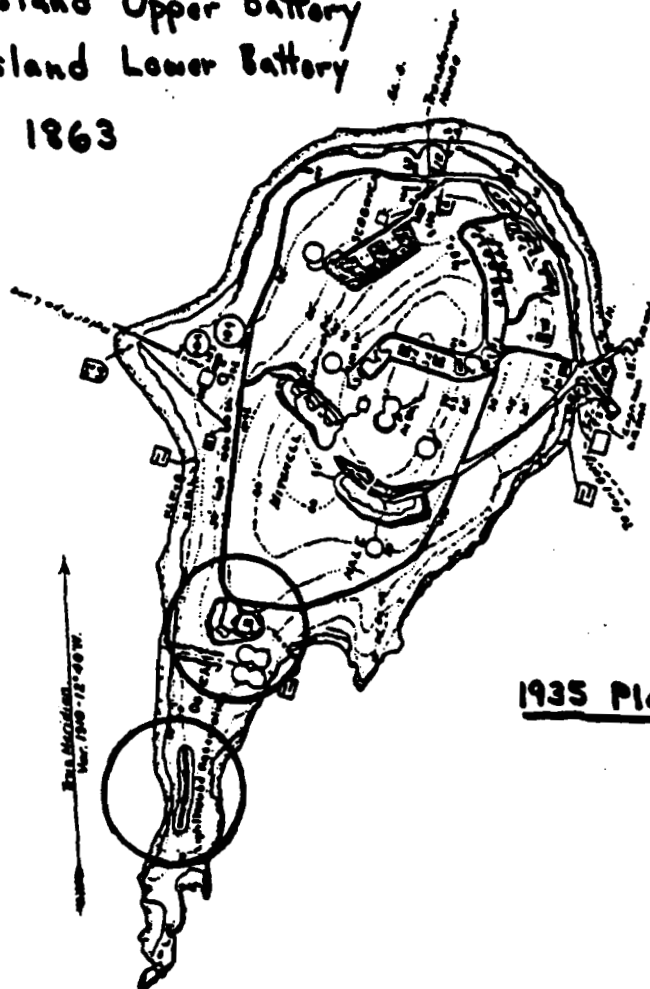

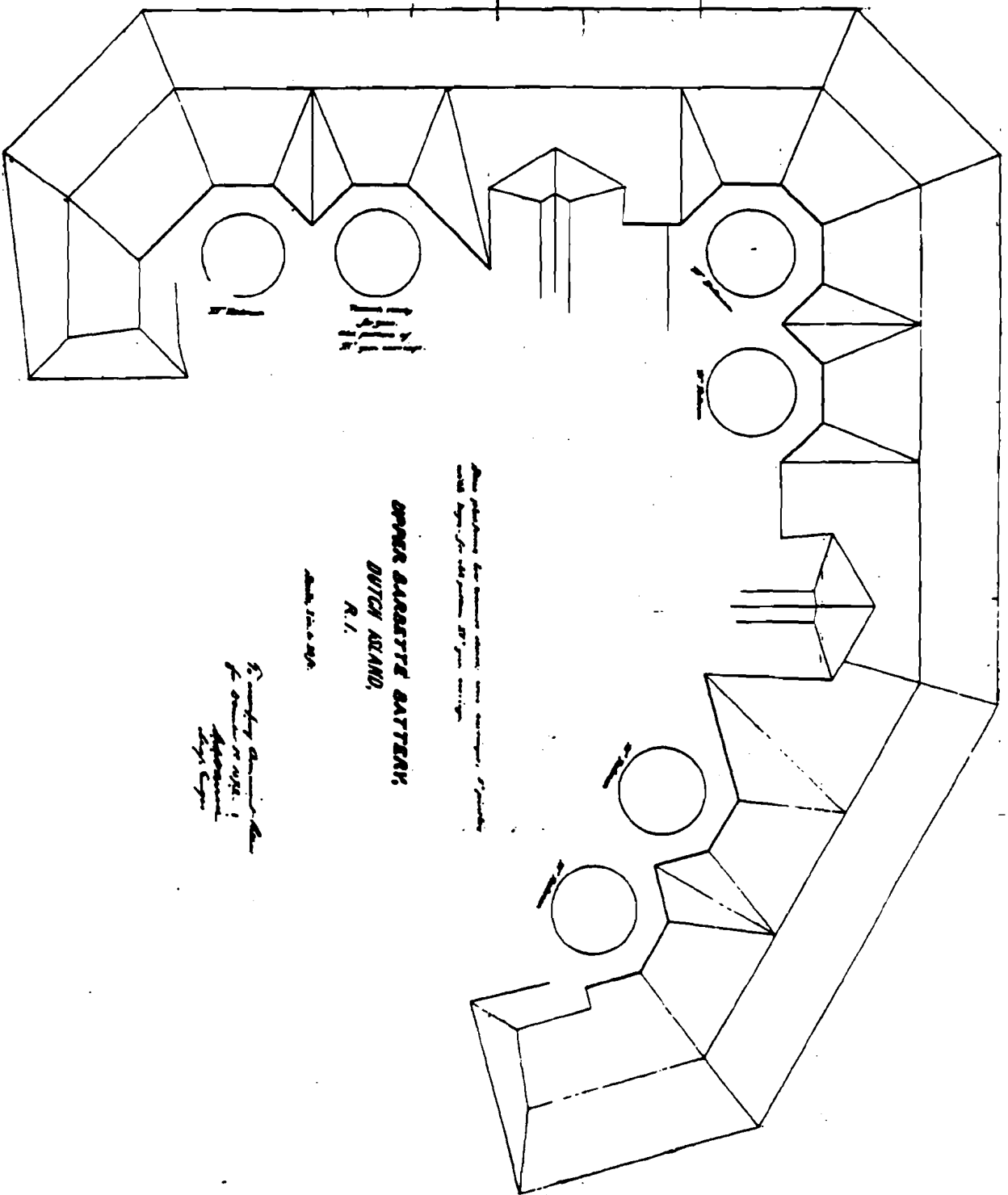
